Alliteration	When two or more words share the same beginning sound	Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers.
Metaphor	Saying one thing is something else	All the world is a stage.
Personification	Giving human qualities to objects or animals	The storm was angry.
Oxymoron	Contradictory terms used side by side	Small crowd, open secret
Onomatopoeia	When a word sounds like what it's describing	Splash, Crack, Boom

I diom	Phrases that have a different meaning to the words used	Saying the car costs an arm and leg, means that the car is expensive
Cliché	A common and overused phrase or expression	Sick and tired. Easy as pie.
Imagery	Words that describe the five senses and create an image in the mind of readers	The campfire crackled and snapped, and a shower of sparks flew up towards the midnight sky.
